<p>The holder of the certificate is qualified to:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>– replace, install and repair vehicle body parts;</li> <li>– diagnose the condition of a vehicle body and painted surfaces;</li> <li>– use measurement and control devices, tools and machinery that are used in the servicing and repair of vehicles;</li> <li>– use technical and technological documents, technical rules and standards and technical plans and instructions provided by the manufacturers;</li> <li>– maintain, repair and replace exhaust systems;</li> <li>– fit auxiliaries and accessories in vehicles;</li> <li>– maintain, repair and implement antirust protection procedures of vehicle body and other component parts of the vehicle;</li> <li>– implement installation and finishing works in vehicles;</li> <li>– maintain and repair rims and ventilation and heating appliances;</li> <li>– advise clients about vehicle repair and maintenance works;</li> <li>– participate in teamwork and communicate with colleagues, professionals and clients in writing and orally using fundamental professional terminology;</li> <li>– implement and provide measures of health and safety at work, environmental protection, fire safety and the prevention of injuries;</li> <li>– hold a positive attitude toward measures aimed at reducing pollution and environmental protection;</li> <li>– assess the rational use of energy and materials, energy sources and waste management;</li> <li>– use modern information technology, work with sources, data and material;</li> <li>– employ entrepreneurial thinking, manage costs and calculations and act responsibly and socially in the work environment.</li> </ul> <p>Optional:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>– use various procedures of processing and soldering metals and profiles and manufacture and repair vehicle body parts;</li> <li>– maintain, repair, manufacture and process vehicle bodies and upgrades,</li> <li>– control, set and service safety and comfort features in vehicles.</li> <li>– diagnose the condition, maintenance, protection and required restoration of vehicle body and painted surfaces;</li> <li>– prepare and apply lining material and paints and final processing and protection of surfaces;</li> <li>– maintain, repair and make interior and exterior painted or varnished surfaces.</li> <li>– control, set and service safety and comfort features in vehicles;</li> <li>– fit auxiliaries and accessories in vehicles and upgrade various devices on the vehicle body.</li> <li>– make surface paintings on vehicle bodies using graphical painting procedures with templates;</li> <li>– master a knowledge of paints, varnishes and solvents, the manner of their preparation and their application on the vehicle body.</li> </ul> <p>In addition, the holder of the certificate also upgraded his/her key professional skills and competences with key general knowledge and skills in line with national standards.</p>

<p>The holder of the certificate can find employment at vehicle body, panel beating or auto body painting shops; car repair, panel beating or body painting shops; companies producing or installing vehicle body parts or dealing with their logistics or car protection formulas.</p>

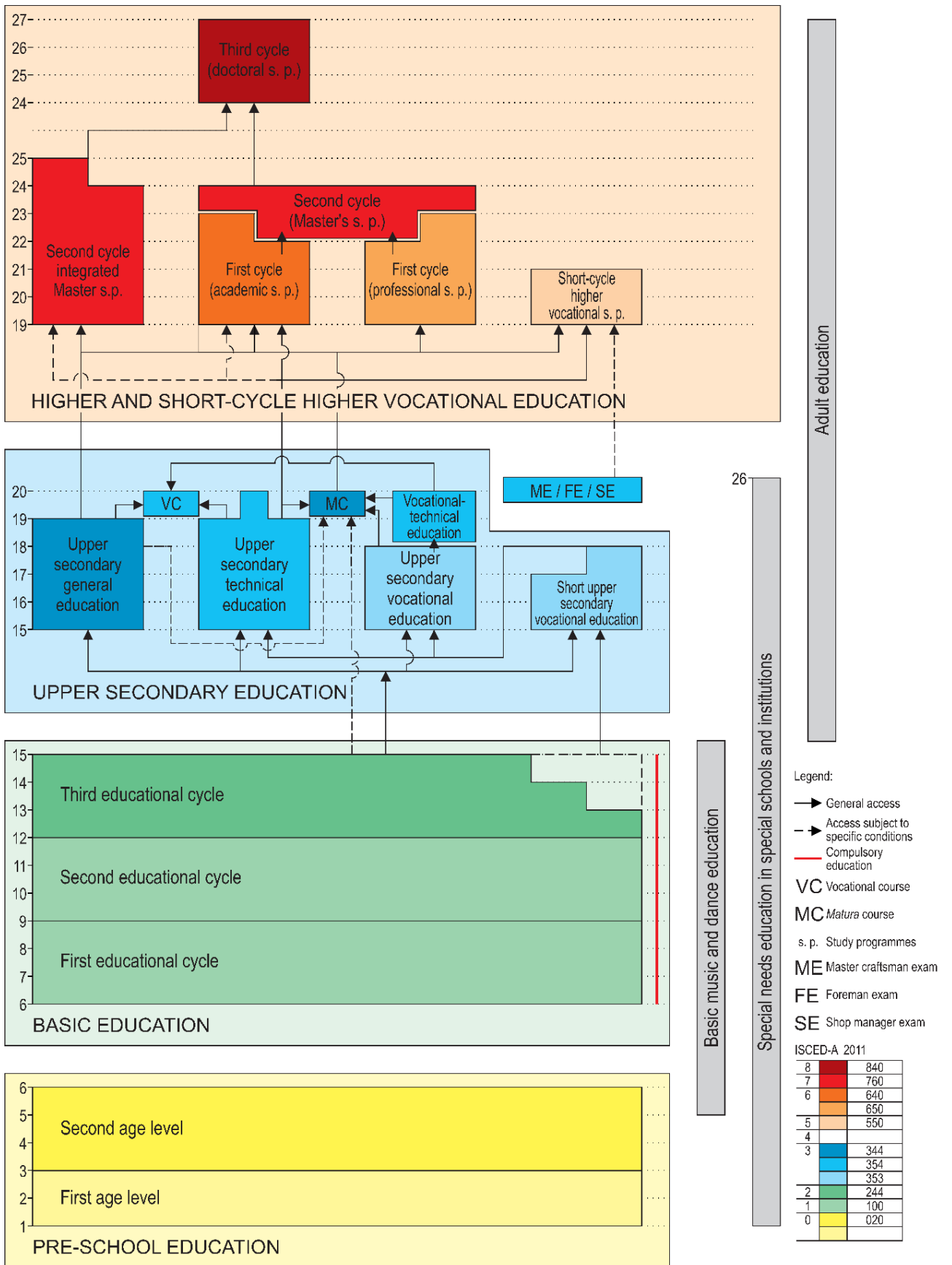
